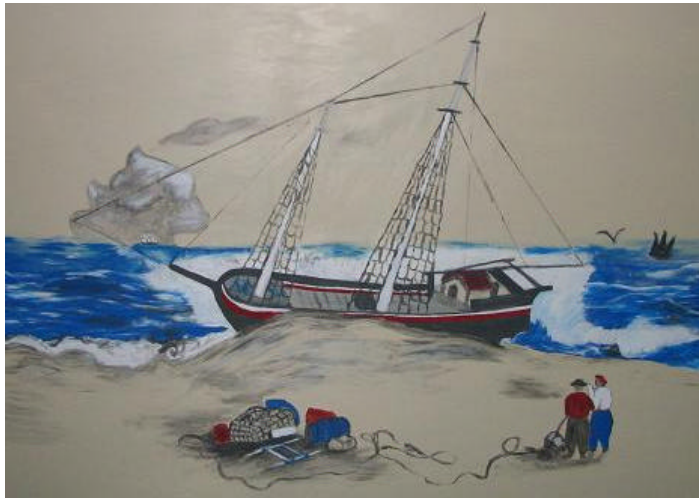
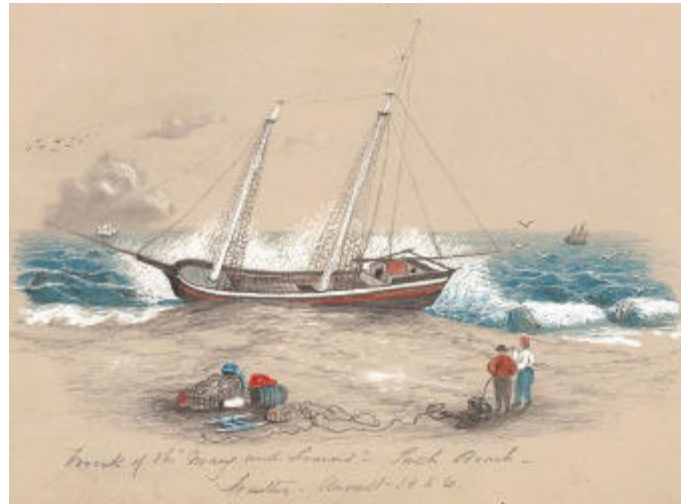

Historical Society Grant Project on Schedule

Through a grant funded by the Hotel/Motel Tax (fund 192), the Historical Society is undertaking a project to commission murals which re-create art from the Katherine Floyd Dana Sketchbook. Local artist Amy Illardo is in the process of hand-painting ten enlarged reproductions of sketches and water-color paintings from the mid-1800's. An example of Katherine's work entitled "Wreck of the Mary and Francis" is pictured to the right; the reproduction (painted in acrylic) is featured below. Two murals have been donated, by the Historical Society, to the Village of Mastic Beach for installation along Neighborhood Road.



Three additional mural are completed and awaiting delivery. There are five additional murals scheduled to be painted and exhibited by the end of the year. The grant is sponsored by County Legislator Kate Browning and administered by the County Parks Department. Original artwork was provided courtesy of the Fire Island National Seashore's William Floyd Estate, a division of the National Park Service.

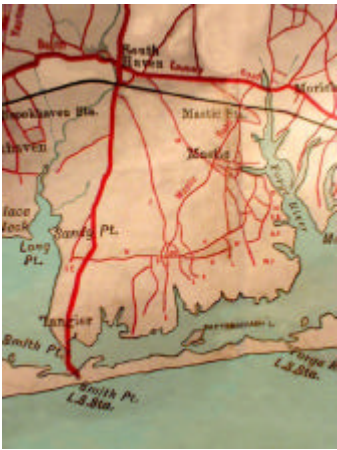

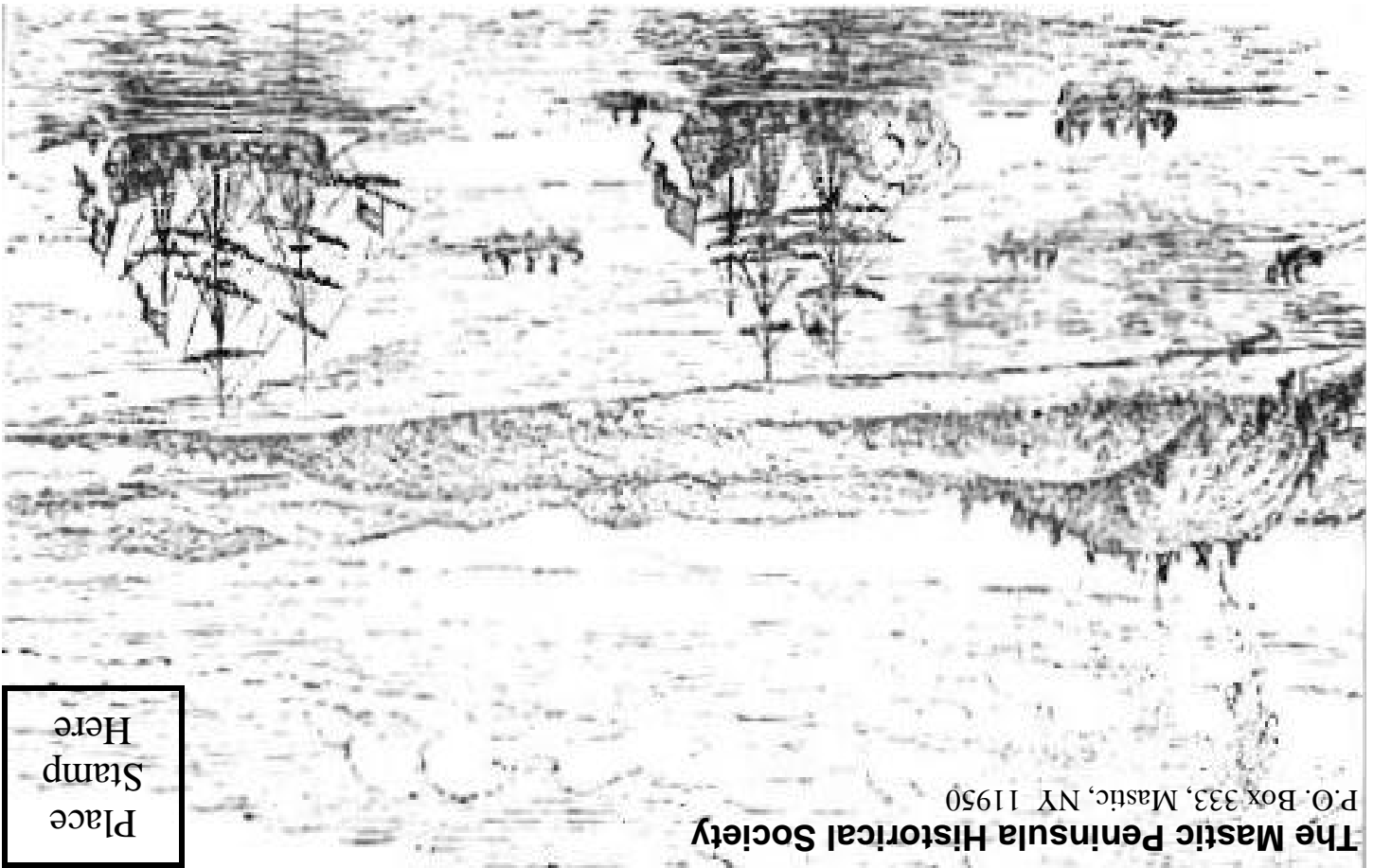
